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





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# INTERNATIONAL UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAMME (iUROP)

iUROP provides exchange students the opportunity to work together with SUTD faculty and students on cutting edge and innovative research projects.

Exchange students will be able to participate in the different phases of research activity which include developing research plans, writing proposals, conducting research, analyzing data and presenting research results in oral and written form. Besides immersing in SUTD's rich research culture, exchange students also get the chance to gain multicultural and interdisciplinary design perspectives.

Each exchange student is allowed to take one iUROP project per term. The exact number of hours depends on the project duration, project nature, students' progress and arrangement with project supervisor, as well as students' own time management.



#### Academic and Research Exchange

Exchange students take a combination of academic subjects and an iUROP project.

#### POSSIBLE COMBINATIONS

4 subjects (48 credits) + iUROP Lite (0 credits)

3 subjects (36 credits) + iUROP Mezzo (12 credits)

2 subjects (24 credits) + iUROP Meta (24 credits)

If necessary, EU students may take up to 60 credits (equivalent to 30 ECTS) for credit

#### Research Exchange

Exchange students take on a full-time iUROP project under the supervision of SUTD faculty, without taking any academic subjects.

- This option is only available to undergraduate exchange students. Post-graduate students may consider Postgraduate Research Internship instead.
- This option is not open to exchange students from Texas A&M University students.

## SUTD TERM WORKLOAD

A full-time term workload at SUTD is 48 credits. Each subject is typically 12 credits (except ASD subjects). You can enrol into a minimum of 24 credits or up to a maximum of 48 credits worth of subjects, including iUROP (if any). All subjects are conducted in-person (except a few HASS subjects conducted virtually).

## Searching for Subjects

- Use the filter in Subject Catalogue to find subjects available to exchange students. You can search by the term the subject is being offered, level of study and identify the pillar/cluster that the subject is hosted under.
- Requests to take subjects not listed in the Subject Catalogue are considered on a case-by-case basis.



#### Subject Selection Guidelines

- In general, DAI, EPD, ESD, ISTD and HASS subjects are available to exchange students. Where pre-requisites are listed, you need to provide the syllabus or links to the subjects you completed at home university in your application.
- The subject catalogue is updated from time-to-time and there may be changes to the subjects offered.

## Restricted Subjects for Exchange Students

- ASD subjects are only available to exchange students from Aalto University, Auckland
  University of Technology, Czech Technical University in Prague, IE University,
  Shanghai Jiao Tong University, Swinburne University of Technology, The Swiss
  Federal Institute of Technology Lausanne (EPFL), University of Auckland, University
  of Seoul, University of Technology Sydney and Zhejiang University.
- Subjects in Term 1, 2 and 3 are not available to exchange students.
- Some subjects are not open to exchange students. Refer to the remarks in the Subject Catalogue.



## SUBJECT APPROVAL AND REGISTRATION PROCESS

- You will be asked to select up to 10 subjects (in order of preference 1st being the most preferred, 10th being the least preferred) during exchange application.
- You are required to choose a host pillar (ASD, EPD, ESD, ISTD or HASS) during exchange application and you can take a combination of subjects from any pillar.
- While every effort is made to accommodate your preferences, subject approval is subjected to fulfilment of pre-requisites and quota. Please keep your study plan flexible and plan for back-up subjects.
- → You will need to register for the subjects for enrolment prior to your arrival in SUTD.
- Subject approval does not translate to guaranteed subject enrolment, due to timetable scheduling. It is possible that the subject may be oversubscribed or cancelled (although this happens seldomly) and you will need to consider other subjects.
- Cross-term and cross-pillar subjects as well as HASS subjects are more likely to have timetable clashes. The timetable is only published two weeks before the term starts.
- It is possible to modify your study plan after the start of the term.
- You may request to add or drop subjects during Add Drop period (first two weeks of the term), depending on meeting pre-requisites, availability and timetable scheduling.

iUROP is not available to exchange students from Texas A&M University (iUROP Max only), Cardiff University, Chongqing University, The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, Tianjin University, University of Ottawa and Vietnam National University, Hanoi - University of Engineering and Technology (VNU-UET).

## +++ Faculty-led iUROP Guidelines

- The list of iUROP projects differ from term to term.
- As allocation of projects is subjected to review, you may not be given your preferred choice. Hence you are required to select up to 5 subjects in order of preference during exchange application.



## Student-initiated iUROP Guidelines

- You are encouraged to secure a SUTD faculty member to supervise your research at SUTD prior to completing your exchange application. You are to fill up <a href="iUROP Proposal">iUROP Proposal</a> (part A) and send to SUTD faculty to discuss on proposal.
- Student is to inform Office of International Relations of successful match by emailing global@sutd.edu.sg.

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#### **EXCHANGE TIMELINE**

**Application** typically starts six months before the exchange. You will receive application instructions from SUTD via email after the nomination has been processed.

#### **SUTD STUDENT INSURANCE**

During your stay in SUTD (from Matriculation Day to end of Term), you will be covered by the SUTD Student Insurance Scheme (policy under NTUC Income).






#### **On-campus Accommodation**



Once you arrive at SUTD, you will be welcomed with a series of activities organised as part of the 2-day compulsory Orientation Programme.


It is a great way to kickstart your exchange at SUTD as you get to meet your fellow exchange students from different universities!

#### **Barrier-free Facilities**



#### **CREDIT SYSTEM**

**CREDIT & GRADING SYSTEM** 

1 SUTD Subject Credit (SCs) is equivalent to 1 hour of workload per week. The subject workload in terms of hours and SCs is represented by a series of 3 numbers. All of the 3 numbers add together to represent the total SCs for the subject.

For example: 3-5-4 (Total SCs is 12)

"3" (first number) represents actual contact hours for lectures or cohortbased learning per week

"5" (second number) represents hours for laboratory, design or fieldwork per week

"4" (third number) refers to hours a student is expected to spend on preparation per week

#### **Submitting Application Procedures**

#### STEP 1 CREATE AN APPLICATION ACCOUNT

Visit Admission Portal (admission.sutd.edu.sg) and create an application account.

Enter your own User ID, Full Name (as per your passport) and your Email Address. You will receive an email with User ID and Password at the email address you have entered upon successful account registration. You will be required to change your password upon the first login.

#### STEP 2 START APPLICATION

- 1. Select Application Type (Inbound) and Period of Study.
- 2. Select the correct Application Programme: Academic and Research / Academic

(for students taking courses)

#### Research Exchange

(for students taking iUROP only)

#### STEP 3 SUBMIT APPLICATION

There are 6 sections in the application.

- Account Holder's Declaration
- Personal Information Personal Particulars, Contact Information etc.
- Academic Qualifications
- Supplementary Results
- Pillar & Subject Selection (for students taking courses)

Please read the instructions carefully at each stage of the application. Ensure that all supporting documents are submitted to avoid delay in processing of your application. Remember to click "Save" after you have completed each section.

#### STEP 4 SUBMIT IUROP PROJECT SELECTION (for students taking iUROP)

For students that are applying for iUROP (part-time or full-time), please ensure you have submitted your project selection via MS Form (forms.office.com/r/TS1Jf7FABD).

Exchange students can undertake a maximum of 1 iUROP project under the supervison of SUTD Faculty.



Please click "Print or get PDF of answers" after you have submitted the MS Form.

All international students must hold a valid Student Pass issued by the Singapore Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA) for their studies at SUTD. Generally, international students studying in SUTD are granted Student Pass for the full duration of the exchange period.

#### STEP 1

#### **Application Through SOLAR System**

Application for Student Pass is to be made through the ICA Student Pass On-Line Application & Registration (SOLAR) system.

SUTD will inform you via email when the SOLAR system is open for application. You are required to login to SOLAR to complete the application, submit eForm16 and make payment of SGD45.00 for the non-refundable processing fee for Student Pass application.

Check your email regularly as ICA may request some applicants to furnish additional documents in support of the application, where necessary.

#### STEP 2

## **Issuance of In Principal Approval (IPA)**

You will be notified via email once your application has been processed. Login to SOLAR system and print out In Principal Approval (IPA) letter (Select "Foreign Student", followed by "Print Outcome Letter" after you entered your details).

For students who require a visa to enter Singapore, a visa will be incorporated in the IPA letter. Students need not apply for a separate visa and may enter Singapore by producing the IPA letter at the customs.

#### STEP 3

#### Making Appointment with ICA

After receiving your IPA letter, login to SOLAR system to make payment of SGD60.00 for issuance fee and SGD30.00 for multiplejourney visa (where applicable). Also, make an appointment with ICA for completion of formalities for the issuance of your Digital Student Pass.

#### STEP 4

#### **Issuance of Digital Student Pass**

Upon arrival in Singapore, report to ICA on your appointment day for completion of formalities for the issuance of your Digital Student Pass. More information will be provided in the SUTD Handbook emailed to you upon exchange offer.

#### STEP 5

#### Self-cancellation of Digital Student Pass

No action is required if you are leaving Singapore before the Student Pass expiry date.

If you wish to remain in Singapore beyond the Student Pass expiry date, you must cancel your Student's Pass via SOLAR system (Select "Cancellation of Student's Pass").

You will be able to retrieve the Short-term Visit Pass document (Select "Print Outcome Letter") after your request has been processed. The document is to be presented to the Immigration Officer when you leave Singapore.



For visa-required nationals who are planning for any overseas trip out of Singapore after the Student Pass is cancelled, you will need to apply for the relevant pass/visa if you wish to re-enter Singapore.

## How can I be nominated for exchange at SUTD?

You must be enrolled as a full-time student at one of our partner universities.

You can then apply through your home university exchange programme and your home university will nominate you.

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## What if my home university is not one of SUTD partner universities?

SUTD only provides student exchange opportunities to students from partner universities whom we have formalized collaborations through official agreements.

Should you be interested to pursue a term of study with SUTD, you may consider the option of enrolling with us as a non-graduating fee-paying student.

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## How many terms can I spend my exchange at SUTD?

You can spend up to a maximum of 3 terms at SUTD, subjected to availability. Reach out to your home university for further advice.

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## What happens after I submit my application?

We will contact you if there are any missing documents or for further clarifications.

Your application will be processed only after the application deadline.

You will be notified via email on the outcome of your application.

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## Can non-engineering students come to SUTD on exchange?

Yes, SUTD offers nonengineering subjects as well, mainly from the Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences (HASS) cluster. As places in each HASS subject are very limited, we advise students to be flexible with their study plan.

In general, students can apply for cross-pillar subjects as long as they fulfil the prerequisites, subjected to availability and timetable scheduling.

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## Can I change my subjects after the start of the exchange?

Yes, there is an Add Drop period in the first two weeks of exchange, where you can add or drop subjects. Adding of subjects is subjected to fulfilment of pre-requisites, availability and timetable scheduling.

You will be briefed on the procedures during Orientation.

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## How can I get my Learning Agreement endorsed?

Please email global@sutd. edu.sg and request for your Learning Agreement to be endorsed.

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## How will I receive my transcript?

Hardcopy transcript will be sent to your home university within two months after the end of exchange.
